Agustín Fuentes is a Professor and Chair of Anthropology at the University of Notre Dame. A biological anthropologist, his interests include primatology, the evolution of social organization, primate ecology and conservation, human-nonhuman primate interactions and Southeast Asia and Gibraltar. He is the author of several books, including his most recent: *Race, Monogamy and Other Lies They Told You: Busting Myths About Human Nature* (2012) and *Evolution of Human*

Behavior (2009), as well as numerous articles in scholarly journals. He is the co-editor of *Ethics in the Field: Contemporary Challenges* (2013), *Centralizing Fieldwork: Critical Perspectives from Primatology, Biological and Social Anthropology* (2011), and *Primates in Perspective* (2007, 2011). His work has been funded by grants from the National Geographic Society, the John Templeton Foundation, the Andrew Mellon Foundation, and the National Science Foundation. In 2012, he was awarded a fellowship at the Center for Theological Inquiry, as a member of the Inquiry on Evolution and Human Nature research team.
